SECOND APPARITION (CONT.) – BACK OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION MEDAL

Mary's voice spoke again, "Have a medal struck after this model.

All who wear it will receive great graces: they should wear it around the neck. Graces will abound for persons who wear it with confidence." The tableau revolved, and St. Catherine beheld the reverse side of the Medal she was to have made. It contained a large M surmounted by a bar and a cross. Beneath the M were the Hearts of Jesus, crowned with thorns and Mary's pierced with a sword. Twelve Stars encircled the whole. Originally, the Medal was known as the Immaculate Conception Medal. Today, because of the many miracles attributed to it, it is known as the Miraculous Medal. St. Catherine Labouré was declared a Saint by Pope Pius XII on July 27, 1947. Our church doctrine explains that our unique soul, precious to God, is given to us at the moment each one of us is conceived.
